Phase two of the Court Case Management Program is continuing to work on the technological solutions that are intended to streamline the work processes for the criminal justice system. Through the introduction of innovative processes and services that will be introduced during the implementation of CCM2, the stakeholders affected will achieve significant value as a result of:

- The introduction of more efficient processes which will automate routine and/or complex tasks that are labour intensive and susceptible to error.
- The integration of existing systems which do not currently share appropriate information and are expensive and cumbersome to maintain.
- The introduction of new methods for accessing information which will increase convenience for stakeholders and reduce the amount of time and effort that must be expended to complete administrative functions in the criminal justice system.

Upcoming for fall 2011

This fall will see the move to an integrated set of technical processes as Jasper continues to be developed. “Jasper” is the name that has been adopted to refer to a collection of applications and processes to support the operations of Provincial adult criminal court. The work being done in the first implementation of CCM2 sets up the solutions to support the future technological changes to streamline the work processes for the criminal justice system. The benefits that will be realized are:

- Jasper support and maintenance established for future growth
- Access to “P” (provincial criminal) files for whole province
- Near real-time JOIN data entry
- Retire the Prosecutors’ file management application and replace it with a new more modern system.

Special points of interest:

- CCM2 sets up the solutions to support the future technological changes
- CCM is preparing to rollout to regional locations



What Does This Mean For You?

The aim of the CCM Program Phase Two is for stakeholders of the criminal justice system to have business and technological solutions that will ensure business value and requirements that can be delivered across organizational boundaries as they evolve. These business requirements are the

driver of technological change, not vice versa.

The solutions developed by CCM2 are part of a collaborative effort that supports the delivery of the business benefits.

Future benefits to be seen include:

- Easier data entry

- More files available for Defence to search
- Streamline process at CMO allowing for faster scheduling
- More efficient file tracking for Crown Prosecutors and staff

Regional Rollout

With judicial leadership, the Court Case Management project is preparing to rollout to regional locations. Preliminary meetings are underway to gather all the information needed to effectively establish CCM in Okotoks and Wetaskiwin. These two locations have been identified as the initial sites of the pilot project for regional implementation.
